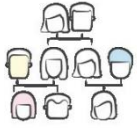

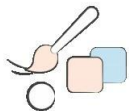

6	<b>Hour</b> (n.)	/aʊr/	Each of the twenty-four time periods in a day, made up of sixty minutes.

4	<b>Foot</b> (n.)	/fʊt/	The body part at the end of our leg that we stand and walk on.
5	<b>Head</b> (n.)	/hed/	The top part of the body, where the brain and face are located.
6	<b>Leg</b> (n.)	/leg/	Each of the two long body parts that we use when walking.
7	<b>Knee</b> (n.)	/niː/	The body part in the middle of the leg that helps it bend.
8	<b>Back</b> (n.)	/bæk/	The part of our body between the neck and legs that we cannot see.
9	<b>Stomach</b> (n.)	/ˈstʌ.mæk/	The body part inside our body where the food we eat goes.
